To qualify for a service animal in most cases your doctor would need to provide a letter stating your need for the service animal.

Service dogs are allowed anywhere a person can go. Therapy dogs are not allowed access to all areas but generally limited to certain medical, rehab, nursing care facilities, and schools, etc.

Dogs are the most often used animals in service and therapy. Horses are also used in therapy.
