The morning of June 17, 2019, her comments on the devotional article, How to Handle Worry and Anxiety in Post Hepatitis C Treatment, were the last words she spoke here on the website. Soon afterward in the afternoon, unexpectedly, she changed her earthly address to heaven, and she left this life to be with the Lord.

How do you say goodbye to someone so dear? Our heads know with full assurance Suzanne is in heaven with Jesus, we rejoice in this fact, but our hearts are hurting. Suzanne left a forever mark on this ministry and to all who knew her. Grief, sorrow, and pain are the price for love, and we loved Suzanne deeply.

Suzanne had a big heart and deep concern for every soul she met, especially if she knew someone was struggling. She had been given an incredible gift of mercy and encouragement. She always had a word of hope and encouraging scripture to share, along with heartfelt prayer to each one here. She shared from her heart and her heart was full of Jesus.

She loved gardening, loved animals (especially seeing and hearing about my crazy mix of dogs, donkeys, and sheep). She dearly loved her husband and best friend, Mark. She loved sharing the love and hope of Christ with others. From the website, she even reached out to another hep C warrior and lead them to Christ.

Countless times she counseled people about hepatitis C on the website and those she met in person. For those that lived near her, she gave them information about her hepatologist and followed up with them on their appointments and progress, encouraging them every step of the

way.

Suzanne was on TV several times with her hepatologist, Dr. Andrew Muir M.D. about hepatitis C and treatment, where she spoke out about the importance of being proactive with hepatitis C.

Many times, she wore her Life Beyond Hepatitis C T-shirt to Duke University hospital and medical center while seeing her physician, she encouraged others who were dealing with liver disease. Sharing hope. Sharing love. Sharing life. She was a voice for advocacy, seeking treatment for hepatitis C and going for the goal of getting cured.

She laughed with us. Prayed with and for us. Loved us unconditionally. She modeled Jesus with skin on and shined brightly in our lives.
