My hemoglobin is still low but has improved since my last test. The one fly in the ointment is my white blood count, which is very low. I continue to be anemic. My doctor has cautioned me not to

get around too many people right now in order not to catch something. But I have high hopes my blood work will improve.

Hep C giant killing is still in progress. I continue to wear my T-shirt, Hep C lives with Me, I don't live with it!

Here's my message to the Hep C virus, "You can run but you can't hide. Your number is up. Your bags are packed. You do not rule my life. You're Toast!" Take that! Sorry, I just felt like saying that. Sometimes you have to tell your enemy they stink.

I am celebrating because there is progress being made all over the place. On my morning walk, I went just a little further today. Hooray! It wasn't far but it was further. It made me feel like skipping and throwing confetti in the air. Ok, I didn't actually skip and throw confetti, but I was doing it in my head and I was having a blast!
