Ever been there in the Hepatitis C battle and tried not to worry? We all go through the shock of diagnosis and working through the many questions and challenges before us. Guest Writer and Hep C Warrior, Colleen Davis shares her story of how she dealt with worry and overcame this great obstacle.

“Who of you by worrying can add a single hour to his life” Matthew 6:27 NIV

I remember that call so well. Standing motionless, staring at the notes I had just scrawled, I waited for the fax machine to beep. The doctor was faxing a copy of my recent blood work results. It was the first written confirmation of a positive result for the Hepatitis C virus. Later on, I would learn that a value of 43 or under is normal; my number was 2.8 million.

That was the beginning of THE BIG WORRY. Panic struck. My heart raced; fear and anxiety seized me. Questions surfaced and swirled through my mind. Were the tests accurate? Could there have been a mistake? How would I tell my new husband of four months? How did I get this disease? Had I passed Hepatitis to my daughter? Should I tell my family members? If people found out, what would I say? Is Hep C curable? How will I live with this shame? What lies ahead for me?

THE BIG WORRY threatened to move into my life.

“Even though I walk through the valley of the shadow of death, I will fear no evil, for you are with me; your rod and your staff, they comfort me.” Psalm 23:4

“When I am afraid, I will trust in you.” Psalm 56:3 NIV

Perhaps you are where I was. Perhaps your BIG WORRY swirls around different issues, but ultimately has the same affect. You may feel alone, desperate, frightened, ashamed, guilty, angry, lost, hopeless and helpless. There is One who is bigger than your WORRY, One who doesn't want you to carry this burden alone.

“Trust in the LORD with all your heart and lean not on your own understanding; in all your ways
