1. God gives you time to prepare prayerfully.
2. God gives you time to plan purposefully.

4. God gives you time to be Thankful, even through the waiting.

But those who wait on the Lord shall renew their strength; They shall mount up with wings like eagles, they shall run and not be weary, they shall walk and not faint. Isaiah 40:31 NKJV (emphasis mine)
